Father of Indian Navy Study Notes: **Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj** is called the father of the Indian Navy. The reason why the great Maratha Emperor is given this title is because of his contribution to the formation of the Naval Wing of the armed forces during the medieval period in India.

"However it was only when India became a republic in 1950, that the Royal Indian Navy -as it had then become known- was renamed to its modern title, the Indian Navy. The 17th-century Maratha emperor **Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj** is considered as the 'Father of the Indian Navy'."

ARTICLE ON ROYAL INDIAN NAVY REVOLT 1946

The Royal Indian Navy mutiny, 1946 was the most critical event in convincing the British government that it could no longer hold on any rule on India. The Royal Indian Navy revolt began on 18 February 1946 in Bombay. The maritime appraisals on HMIS Talwar challenged the low quality of food and racial separation by British officials.
