NATIONAL CADET CORPS - The Wings of Youth

The National Cadet Corps is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi, India. It is open to schools and colleges on voluntary basis a tri-Service organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air - Wing engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizen.

HISTORY OF NCC :

The NCC in India was formed by the act of 1950. It can be traced back to the 'University Corps' which was created under the Indian Defence Act 1917, with the Army. Then after in order to make it more attractive to the youth it was changed into 'University Training Corps' (UTC) in the year 1920. In 1942 British government established 'University Officers Training Corps' during World War 2. After the Independence a committee headed with H. N. Kumbhar recommended a cadet organization to be established in schools and colleges. And finally the National Cadet Corps act was passed in 16th April 1948 and NCC came into existence on 15th July 1948.

MOTTO AND AIM

The discussion for the Motto was started in 11th August 1978. But later on 12th October 1980, the Motto, **UNITY AND DISCIPLINE** was declared on the 12th Meeting of Central Advisory Meeting (CAM) for NCC. In living its Motto, the NCC strives to be and is one of the greatest cohesive forces of the Nation, bringing together the youth and molding them into united and disciplined citizen of Nation.
